2020 Legislative Strategic Actions

- Provide funding specifically used for access/equity culturally responsive solutions for all district staff/community partners.
- Provide funding for school-based early childhood programming and facilities while allowing flexibility to districts to provide services.
- Support legislation to allow career/alternate pathways to licensure for teachers in collaboration with higher education.
- Increase formula allowance to give districts greater flexibility to improve safety and security in school facilities.

- Reform the education funding system to provide stable and predictable funding, reduce dependence on operating levies and improve the equalization factor to lower local property tax obligations.
- Fund special education at 100 percent.
- Reduce mandates related to special education paperwork and redundant state reporting.
- Recognition and coverage for intensive outpatient programs by the Minnesota Department of Human Services Prepaid Medical Assistance Program Health Plans for students in need of this service.
