MESSAGE FROM SUPERINTENDENT PETERSON



The Minnesota legislative session has begun, and Mankato Area Public Schools is fully engaged with our elected officials in Saint Paul about the impact their work will have on the students and families we serve in our school district.

Prior to the session, internal and external partners worked together to develop the 2023 MAPS Legislative Platform. We are proud to include School Board members, teachers, district leaders, community members, parents and students in this work, who helped identify the major areas for MAPS that need legislative action.

The Mankato Area Public Schools' Legislative Committee developed a legislative platform that reflects the urgent challenges we face, including chronic underfunding of public education, mental health support for students and staff, and teacher recruitment. Each priority identified by the committee links to the overarching need to fully fund public education. Full funding has several elements, including:

- Tying per pupil funding to inflation. Currently, there is a \$1,605 gap per student.
- Funding special education and eliminating the need for local school districts to use general education dollars to cover underpaid federal and state responsibilities. This is often referred to as the 'cross subsidy'. For MAPS, this is over \$7 million per year.
- Funding all state mandates.
- Funding school districts to ensure that appropriate staffing can be maintained for all students. Staffing needs affected are in the areas of special education and non-special education, academic and behavioral intervention, social workers and paraprofessionals.
- Prioritizing pre-kindergarten and early childhood education access by funding school-based early childhood programming, including fully funded preschool

MAPS is fortunate to have elected officials who understand the important link between a strong public school system and the long-term viability and health of our communities and state. Our ongoing conversations are focused on how the decisions we make today about public schools not only affect our current reality, but ensures that we are poised for strong and effective service that will be sustainable into the future.

When fully funded, Mankato Area Public Schools will be positioned to raise the achievement of all students by empowering staff with the resources that are required to fully support students so they can realize their fullest potential.


January:

BOARD TO REVIEW REFERENDUM SURVEY RESULTS



The MAPS School Board reviewed the results of the January referendum poll at their work session on February 6th. MAPS continues to prepare for a potential referendum in November 2023 that will address long-range facility and operational needs of schools.

The survey, conducted by the the Morris Leatherman Group, sought resident feedback on their interest and support of a wide range of school needs, including:

- Welcoming and safe entrances at numerous schools in the district
- Expanded early learning and day care options
- Swimming pool in the West attendance area
- Remodeling at West High School, similar to renovations made to East High School less than 10 years ago
- Outdoor community, education, and athletic improvements
 District leaders and School Board members will use the
 information from the survey to help inform the size, scope and
 timing of a community referendum.

BUDGET ADJUSTMENT PROCESS PLANS

The school district's current budget year ends on June 30, 2023, and district leaders have begun developing plans to ensure next year's school year budget is balanced. To meet this goal, a nine million dollar budget adjustment is needed.

Superintendent Peterson and Director of Business Services, Amanda Heilman, are meeting with all schools in the district to provide an overview of the reduction target and how staff can provide input and feedback on the process. Adjustments for next year will be challenging, especially given the fact that the school district has cut over \$11 million from its expense budget in the last three years.

The MAPS School Board will provide the community with updates on the process at their meetings, and will also outline the ways for community members to share ideas to keep our schools strong and financially stable for the future.
